Job Title: Events Volunteer

Purpose: Volunteers in this role help to deliver a variety of different events at Daly House from planning and preparation to setting up and running activities on the day of the event. It's about offering visitors something fun and memorable and encouraging them to return and tell their friends about the museum.

What this role will entail:

Volunteers in this role will be added to the Events Volunteer Register. When a volunteering opportunity arises, an email or phone call will be sent out to the volunteer. This volunteering opportunity many involve preparing for, advertising, or helping out at an event. If a volunteer is interested they just need to email or call back to let the Museum staff know that they would like to help out.

Volunteer Tasks:

- Engaging with visitors of all ages by providing a warm friendly welcome to all visitors as the
 public face of Daly House Museum, answering any questions and encouraging people to get
 involved in the event/ activity
- Helping out at events for adults; taking names at the door; serving refreshments; providing
 information; running stalls; assisting with activities; ticket selling and cash handling; requesting
 feedback
- Helping out at events for children: helping to facilitate craft, storytelling and other hands-on activities; stewarding at large events; requesting feedback
- Setting up for and tidying up after the event
- Photography: taking photos at the event/activity; obtaining permission forms
- Advertising events: uploading event details online; distributing posters
- Monitoring gallery floors, enforce visitor guidelines during events
- Ensure the safety of visitors and artifacts
